UK Wood Production and Trade (provisional figures)

This publication contains provisional statistics for 2006 on UK wood production and trade. They are based on surveys of the forest sector and trade data from HM Revenue & Customs. Data from these sources will be used for reporting to international organisations for publication in their databases and compendia.

The provisional figures for 2006 indicate:

- Harvesting of UK roundwood:
 - 8.6 million green tonnes of softwood; a 1% increase from 2005
 - 0.4 million green tonnes of hardwood; a 27% fall from 2005
- UK roundwood deliveries to industries and others:
 - Total: 8.8 million tonnes of roundwood (softwood and hardwood); a 1% fall from 2005;
 - Sawmills: 5.3 million green tonnes; a 5% increase;
 - Woodbased panels: 1.4 million green tonnes; a 9% decrease:
 - Integrated pulp and paper mills: 0.5 million green tonnes;
 a 25% fall;
 - Other uses, including round fencing, woodfuel, shavings and exports of roundwood: 1.5 million green tonnes; unchanged from 2005.
- UK production of wood products in 2006 included:
 - 3.0 million cubic metres of sawnwood (an increase of 4% from 2005);
 - 3.5 million cubic metres of woodbased panels (a 3% increase from 2005);
 - 5.6 million tonnes of paper and paperboard (a 7% fall from 2005).

Trade:

- UK imports in 2006 included 7.7 million cubic metres of sawnwood, 3.4 million cubic metres of woodbased panels and 9.3 million tonnes of pulp and paper.
- The total value of wood product imports in 2006 was £6.1 billion, of which £4.1 billion was pulp and paper. Pulp and paper also accounted for the majority of exports, generating £1.3 billion in 2006 out of a total of £1.5 billion for all wood product exports.

REMOVALS OF ROUNDWOOD

It is estimated that a total of 9.0 million green tonnes of roundwood was removed from UK woodlands in 2006. This represented a 1% fall from the 2005 figure of 9.1 million green tonnes.

Coniferous wood (softwood) accounted for the majority of removals (95%). Softwood removals from UK woodland totalled 8.6 million green tonnes in 2006, a 1% increase on the previous year's figure.

DELIVERIES OF ROUNDWOOD

In 2006, deliveries of UK roundwood totalled 8.8 million green tonnes, a 1% fall from the 2005 figure.

Most UK roundwood deliveries (95%) were softwood, a total of 8.3 million green tonnes in 2006. 63% of UK softwood deliveries were used by sawmills.

There was a total of 0.4 million green tonnes of UK hardwood deliveries in 2006. The majority of UK hardwood deliveries (58%) were used for woodfuel.

SAWMILLS

In 2006, UK sawmills consumed a total of 5.5 million green tonnes of softwood, a 5% increase from 2005. A further 86 thousand green tonnes of hardwood were consumed by UK sawmills in 2006, a 19% drop from the previous year.

Table 5 provides statistics for the sawnwood output of UK sawmills that mainly use UK sawlogs. This includes sawnwood produced at these mills from imported logs. In addition to producing sawnwood, sawmills also produce other products, including chips and sawdust, which mostly went to woodbased panel and pulp/paper mills in the years reported. A total of 3.0 million cubic metres of sawnwood was produced in the UK in 2006, a 4% increase from 2005.

WOODBASED PANEL PRODUCTS

Table 6 shows the inputs to UK mills that produce woodbased panels. The woodbased panel mills used a total of 4.3 million tonnes of material in 2006, a 1% increase on the 2005 total. The inputs in 2006 comprised 1.4 million tonnes of roundwood (31%), 1.8 million tonnes of sawmill products (41%) and 1.2 million tonnes of recycled wood fibre (27%).

Table 7 shows the output of UK mills that produce woodbased panels. A total production of 3.5 million cubic metres of woodbased panels is estimated for 2006, an increase of 3% from the 2005 total of 3.4 million cubic metres.

PULP & PAPER INDUSTRY

Table 8 shows the inputs to the integrated pulp and paper mills in the UK. These mills used a total of 0.7 million tonnes of material (mainly softwood) in 2006, a 20% fall from the total of 0.9 million tonnes in 2005.

Most UK paper production uses recovered waste paper or imported pulp. The figures shown below for pulp are for wood pulp as an intermediate product in integrated pulp & paper mills. Pulp is also produced from non-wood fibres. A total of 287 thousand tonnes of wood pulp were produced in the UK in 2006, a 16% decrease from the 2005 total of 341 thousand tonnes.

A total of 5.6 million tonnes of paper and paperboard were produced in the UK in 2006, a 7% drop from the previous year. Graphic papers (including newsprint) accounted for 44% of the total UK paper production, packaging materials for 31%, and sanitary and household papers for 14%.

IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

Statistics on imports and exports are compiled by HM Revenue & Customs from trade declarations and Intrastat reporting for intra-EC trade. Tables 11 to 14 are based on the published UK overseas trade statistics. The main imports are paper, sawnwood and pulp. A total of 7.6 million tonnes of paper was imported into the UK in 2006. Total wood imports in 2006 comprised 7.7 million cubic metres of sawnwood, 3.4 million cubic metres of woodbased panels and 1.3 million cubic metres of roundwood.

A total of 5.4 million tonnes of pulp and paper (including recovered paper) was imported into the UK in 2006. The quantity of recovered paper imports has more than trebled over the last 5 years, whilst there has been a four-fold increase in roundwood exports.

Table 13 shows the value of wood product imports into the UK. Wood product imports in 2006 were valued at a total of £6.1 billion. This comprised 67% pulp and paper (mainly paper), 19% sawnwood, 12% woodbased panels and 2% roundwood.

Table 14 shows the value of wood product exports into the UK. Wood product exports were valued at a total of £1.5 billion in 2006. This comprised 86% pulp and paper (mainly paper), 9% woodbased panels, 3% sawnwood and 2% roundwood.

Background

The figures in this publication are provisional. Final figures will be published in summary form in "Forestry Facts and Figures 2007" on 27 September 2007. More detailed results will be available in "Forestry Statistics 2007", to be released on 25 October 2007.

Most of these statistics are used to compile data which are sent to international organisations in joint questionnaires (JQ1 and JQ2), in some cases giving more detail than in this statistical release. These returns (not National Statistics) are published on the Forestry Commission website; provisional figures in May and final figures in September. The statistics are used by Eurostat Forestry Statistics, UNECE Timber Bulletins, and UN/FAO Forest Product Statistics and are published on the FAOSTAT database (www.fao.org/forestry/site/29420/en).

Statistics on imports and exports are based on the published overseas trade statistics for intra-EC trade and extra-EC trade produced by HM Revenue & Customs and available at www.uktradeinfo.com. Figures are adjusted using standard FAO/ECE conversion factors, where the reporting units for quantity differ from those required on the international return. They may also be adjusted where an apparent inconsistency in the UK trade figures cannot be resolved before the international return is required.

The statistics in this release and in the international returns are only available as UK totals. Some statistics on wood production are available broken down by country (England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland). These will be published with Forestry Statistics 2007; previous data were included in UK Timber Statistics 2006 and in Forestry Statistics 2006.

Statistics on international trade flows (by country of source and country of destination) are available from the FAOSTAT website (www.fao.org/forestry/site/29420/en).

Coniferous wood is wood from trees such as spruce, pine and larch, and is also called softwood. Non-coniferous wood is wood from species such as oak, birch and beech, and is also called hardwood.

Figures in tables have been independently rounded, so may not add to the totals shown.

Revisions: Figures shown for 2005 and earlier years have been revised from those reported to international organisations and published in Forestry Statistics 2006 and previous publications.
